Guidelines

General information

- · Roads and Maritime Services (Roads and Maritime) administers and maintains the Safety, Productivity & Environment Construction Transport Scheme (SPECTS or the Scheme)
- This form is for use by operators making an application for enrolment of eligible vehicles in the Safety, Productivity & Environment Construction Transport Scheme (SPECTS or the Scheme) under the NSW Class 2 Safety, Productivity & Environment Construction Transport Authorisation Notice 2016 (the Notice)
- This form is also to be used to enrol eligible vehicles in the Intelligent Access Program (IAP) and approved On Board Mass (OBM) systems linked to IAP (IAP-linked OBM) in NSW, which are conditions of enrolment under SPECTS
- . This form must be submitted along with documentary evidence confirming your eligible vehicles meet the Scheme conditions set out in the Notice and the SPECTS Business Rules
- · Completed form along with documentary evidence and supporting documents are to be submitted by email or mail. Contact details are provided on page 2
- · By completing and submitting this form, you agree that you have read and accept the Scheme Business Rules and the IAP terms and conditions for the enrolment of eligible vehicles for SPECTS under the IAP, IAP-linked OBM and SPECTS in NSW. The SPECTS Business Rules and the IAP Terms and Conditions are available for viewing and download from the Roads and Maritime website at www.rms.nsw.gov.au/spects
- The information provided in and with this application form will be used by Roads and Maritime to determine whether your vehicle is eligible to enrol in IAP, IAP-linked OBM and SPECTS in NSW
- Roads and Maritime will continue to administer all IAP services
- · Under the Heavy Vehicle National Law (HVNL), the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) is responsible for the administration of the IAP
- Transport Certification Australia (TCA) nationally administers the use of IAP-linked OBM, allowing Roads and Maritime and other road managers in NSW to grant access to routes that may have previously been unavailable for these vehicle types due to infrastructure risks
- Please note the IAP terms and conditions may change from time to time and notifications will be sent to you via the email address provided

Eligibility

- . The following types of heavy vehicles are eligible to enrol in the Scheme if they have a Performance Based Standards (PBS) approved vehicle that meets the PBS Bridge Loading standard at Tier 1 (except for the quad axle prime mover semi-trailer combinations listed at paragraph c) and paragraph e) which may operate under the Scheme if they meet the PBS Bridge Loading standard at Tier 3) and is:
 - a) A PBS Level 1 or 2A 3 or 4 axle rigid truck towing a 3 axle dog trailer with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 54.0 tonnes and with a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres; or
 - A PBS Level 1 or 2A 3 or 4 axle rigid truck towing a 4 axle dog trailer with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 57.5 tonnes and with a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres; or
 - A PBS Level 1 prime mover semi-trailer combination with a quad axle group with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 50.5 tonnes and with a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres (this combination may operate if it meets the Bridge Loading standard at Tier 3); or
 - A PBS Level 1 prime mover semi-trailer combination with a tri-axle group with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 46.0 tonnes and with a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres; or
 - A PBS Level 1 concrete agitator prime mover semi-trailer combination with a quad axle group with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 50.5 tonnes and has a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres (this combination may operate if it meets the Bridge Loading standard at Tier 3); or
 - A PBS Level 1 concrete agitator prime mover semi-trailer combination with a tri-axle group with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at up to 46.0 tonnes and has a maximum overall length no greater than 20.0 metres; or
 - A rigid concrete agitator with a current PBS Vehicle Approval for operation at PBS Level 1; and
 - Has a maximum height of 4.3m; and
 - Is engaged in "construction activity".

Eligible vehicles must have the following safety and environmental features set out in the Scheme Business Rules:

- Electronic Stability Control (ESC) on vehicles manufactured on or after 1 January 2017 as defined in section 4.5 Stability Control of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.12)
- · Roll-over control system on trailers to be fitted on vehicles manufactured on or after 1 January 2017 in conjunction with ESC as defined in section 4.5 Stability Control of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.12)
- Systems to improve visibility and detection of vulnerable road users, such as blind spot mirrors as defined in section 4.7 Visibility/ detection of vulnerable road users of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.13)
- Reversing lights on both truck and trailer as defined in section 4.8 Reversing lamps of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.14)
- Enhanced vehicle visibility markings using retro-reflective tape to provide a contour outline of the vehicle as defined in section 4.6 Contour marking of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.13)
- "Smart" reversing alarm, which adjusts the noise level to be appropriate for the environment that the vehicle operates in, on both the truck and trailer as defined in section 4.9 Self-adjusting reversing alarm of the SPECTS Business Rules (p. 14)
- At least Euro 5 diesel engine as defined in section 4.10 Engine emissions standards of the SPECTS Business Rules (p.14)

'Eligibility' guidelines continued

Eligible vehicles must also:

- · Be enrolled in the IAP and IAP-linked OBM in NSW
- · Be currently registered in an Australian jurisdiction
- Be issued and comply with the PBS Vehicle Approval, which sets out the approved combination and the required national operating conditions
- Comply with all the conditions set out in the SPECTS Business Rules and the Notice.

IAP and IAP-linked OBM

If your vehicle is eligible under SPECTS, Roads and Maritime will enrol your eligible vehicle in the IAP and IAP-linked OBM in NSW as part of enrolling in the Scheme. You will be issued two interim Intelligent Access Conditions (IAC) via email. You must provide both interim IACs to your chosen IAP Service Provider who will install the IAP and IAP-linked OBM equipment in your vehicle(s). A list of IAP Service Providers is available at www.tca.gov.au/certified-services/iap.

All costs related to the fitment of the in-vehicle units and IAP-linked OBM equipment and for the provision of vehicle monitoring must be borne by the operator.

The certified IAP Service Provider will advise Roads and Maritime when the IAP and IAP-linked OBM equipment have been installed and are available for monitoring. Your vehicle is then enrolled in the IAP and IAP-linked OBM in NSW, and Roads and Maritime will issue you a Welcome Letter with an:

- IAP Certificate of Enrolment for your heavy motor vehicle stating the SPECTS and OBM SPECTS IAP networks/schemes; and
- · SPECTS stickers for each of your vehicle units.

Documentary evidence

At the time of lodging the application form for enrolment in SPECTS the applicant must provide satisfactory documentary evidence that the vehicle meets all of the conditions set out in the SPECTS Business Rules. The following forms of evidence are acceptable for use for enrolment in SPECTS:

- Where the vehicle is new and the required equipment and fittings were included as part of the manufacture process a letter or report from the vehicle manufacturer. The letter or report must specify each part of the equipment or fittings that is fitted to the vehicle; or
- Where the required equipment and fittings were fitted after the manufacture process a letter or report from the vehicle or equipment manufacturer or dealer or supplier or installer who fitted the equipment. The letter or report must specify each part of the equipment or fittings that is fitted to the vehicle; or
- A letter or report from an Authorised Vehicle Examiner (AVE) certifying that the vehicle is fitted with the required equipment and fittings. The letter or report must specify each part of the equipment or fittings that is fitted to the vehicle. (Note that in providing such a letter or report the AVE is not exercising a function under the Vehicle Standards Compliance Certification Scheme (VSCCS)); or
- A statutory declaration from the applicant attesting that the vehicle is fitted with the required equipment and fittings. The declaration must specify each part of the equipment or fittings that is fitted to the vehicle.

In addition the applicant must provide:

- · Application form completed and signed
- · PBS Vehicle Approval
- Letter from the vehicle/suspension manufacturer stating the Road Friendly Suspension (RFS) details of the suspension system(s) certified in accordance with the Commonwealth VSB 11 (if required)
- Letter of consent from registered operator for registering vehicles in the IAP (if the application is not a registered operator).
